

Mural

A mural is painted on the cistern wall that depicts a railroad lumber crew clear-cutting the pine forest to meet the railroad's needs for lumber for tracks and wood to burn for steam. This activity alarmed "Old Village" and "New Summerville" residents because pine trees keep the community healthy. "Old Village" and "New Summerville," petitioned the state to become a city to prevent clear-cutting. Granted city status in December 1847, The Town passed an ordinance that trees cannot be cut down in Summerville without the Town's permission.
